## I. A Greater Than Jonah Is Here

Jonah was from Gath-hepher in Galilee. (II Kings 14:25)
Jesus was from Nazareth in Galilee. (Matt. 2:22-23; Acts 2:22)

•Jonah was sent by God on a mission to the lost. (Jonah 1:2; 4:1-2) —Jesus was sent on a mission to the lost. (Jn. 4:34; Lk. 19:10)

•Jonah slept in a boat during a storm. (Jonah 1:5)

-Jesus asleep on a boat during a storm. (Mk. 4:35-39)

• Jonah told them how to calm the sea. (Jonah 1:12)

-Jesus calmed the sea. (Mk. 4:39)

• Jonah was willing to sacrifice himself for others. (Jonah 1:12)

-Jesus in the eternal plan of God sacrificed himself for the world. (Gen. 3:15; I Pet. 1:18-20; Jn. 10:17; Jn. 3:16) For sinners. (Rom. 5:6-8)

•In Jonah's case, a prayer for forgiveness by those who sacrificed him. (Jonah 1:14)

-Jesus prayed for the forgiveness of those who crucified him. (Lk. 23:34)

•Jonah, a prophet, proclaimed a message of repentance. (Jonah 3:4; 8-10)

-Jesus, Prophet, Priest and King proclaimed a message of repentance. (Matt. 4:17; Lk. 13:3; 24:47)

• Jonah knew that God is gracious, merciful and kind. (Jonah 4:2)

-Jesus manifested the grace, mercy and kindness of God. (Jn. 1:17; Matt. 9:26; Jn. 14:9)

• Jonah was the only minor prophet in whose life miracles played a prominent role.

-Jesus life and claims were attested to by miracles. (Acts 2:22)

- II. The Sign:
  - -Jonah in the belly of the fish was a sign to the Ninevites. (Lk. 11:29-30)
  - -The resurrection of Jesus was the ultimate sign...
    - •Proof of His Deity and the claims he made (Rom. 1:3-4)

•Provided victory over the devil. (Heb. 2:14-15)

•Provides assurance that we too will be raised from the dead. (I Cor. 15:23)

•Provides for us, along with his sacrificial death, justification. (Rom. 4:25)

•Provides the hope of eternal life. (I Pet. 1:3-5)
